Needless to say on the way home the boys were fast asleep after all that sea air!

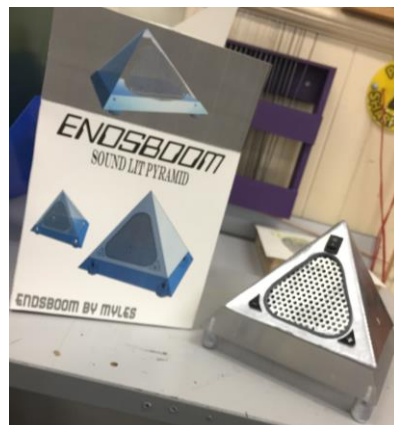
