Year 9 B Team- NATIONAL CUP WINNERS!



On Tuesday Carshalton Boys history was once again created by a Year 9 football team as the 9B's became National Cup champions. They overcame a thrilling comeback from Manchester based opponents Audenshaw School to triumph 5-4 on penalties after an entertaining 3-3 draw.

After travelling up to Derby on the Monday night, the boys arrived bright and early at Pride Park Stadium, home of Derby County FC on Tuesday morning. They were able to take in the surroundings of the stadium and familiarise themselves with the arena where they were to do battle for the trophy. With strong support behind them at both the stadium and back in SM5 the game started with both teams' seemingly nervous and trying to get a foothold in the game. However it was Car Boys who struck first, after

7 minutes a whipped free kick from Connor Moody evaded the Audenshaw keeper at his near post and hit the back of the net to put the swans 1-0 up. The goal gave Carshalton confidence and around 12 minutes later they doubled their lead, a throw from Dan Whitfield found Kole Nicholls who produced a fine piece of skill to escape the defender, he stood his left footed cross up to the back post which was met by skipper Mitchell Doran-Dobson who volleyed home, 2-0 and the swans looked in full control.

That was how it stayed until the half time break, allowing manager Danny Dudley to get his troops in for a well-deserved rest and to reiterate the tactics for the second half. Within minutes of the second half it looked like game over, that man Nicholls again got onto the end of Ekin Ho's pass and stood a delicious cross up for Moody, who made no mistake with his header to make it 3-0. The third goal seemed to spark Audenshaw into life, a left footed corner was unfortunately put past his own keeper by Whitfield for 3-1 and just 5 minutes later it was 3-2 after a loose ball fell to the Audenshaw midfielder who fired past Kacper Oleksiak, game on and the Mancunians smelt blood. The last 15 minutes saw Car Boys with their backs against the wall, some last ditch tackles and great saves from Oleksiak preventing Audenshaw getting level. As the assistant referee signalled 3 minutes of additional time it looked like the Swans had done enough to hold on, or had they..... A high looped cross from the left hand side looked like it had evaded everyone, all except the Audenshaw winger who did brilliant to pull the ball back across goal a touch from Oleksiak took the ball into the path of an Audenshaw player who made no mistake from 5 yards and fired home, 3-3 with literally 30 seconds left to play how would the swans recover from this. The referees whistle signalled the end of normal time, the game would be decided by kicks from the penalty spot.



Audenshaw starting proceedings by scoring their first, which was matched by Nicholls. Then the turning point Oleksiak producing a great save from Audenshaws second kick which allowed Moody to slot home for 2-1. Both teams then scored their next 2 penalties the Swans being converted by Joe Hughes and Sahail Ariayee. 4-4 with one penalty remaining for the Swans, it was down to Max Hands to become the hero, however his spot kick was saved by the keeper, so into sudden death went the shoot-out. Audenshaw were first up but dramatically the kick hit the crossbar, the pendulum swinging back in the Swans favour. Who would be the hero.... Up stepped commanding centre back Josh Richardson who smashed the ball straight down the middle and into the back of the net.... **It was over Carshalton Boys were National champions.**

The penalty sparked absolute scenes both at Pride Park and back at school, all that was left was for Doran-Dobson to lift the trophy to the delight of everyone involved. I'm sure you will agree this is an absolutely fantastic achievement from the boys who are now officially the best B team in the entire country. Thanks to everyone for their continued support in letting year 9 leave lessons early and special thanks to Steve, Joe, Josh, Simon and Julie for accompanying on the day. NCOP Launch event – Tuesday 16th May

The National Collaborative Outreach Programme aims to support the most disadvantaged young people in England to progress into higher education (HE). It will run from 2016-17 to 2019-20. It target students from specific postcodes to encourage them to progress to Higher Education.

32 students across Year 9-12 have been selected.

On Tuesday all the chosen cohort from the four years came together to hear a bit about the programme, and staff spoke more about the programme and their support for it. A member of Aimhigher staff leading on NCOP also came to speak a little about the project and engage with the students. A current year 13 student and a first year undergraduate talked about the Aimhigher process by which they made up their mind up about what to do at university (both talked about practical sessions they'd experienced on a visit to a local university). The learners were then asked to fill in a simple mind map of what they would like to get out of the programme and some other basic information.

This is an exciting national project and one our school will be actively engaged in as part of our commitment to Aimhigher and engaging students in Higher Education.
