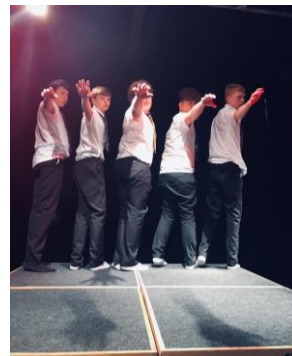
## Year 12 Economics Trip

In the morning we had a fantastic talk by one of the Bank of England economists and a look around the museum where some of the students tried to lift the ingot of gold on display. Each team had a set of 10 clues to crack ranging from finding the entrance to the leaky cauldron to visiting Lloyds of London. All of the tasks were aimed at ensuring they familiarised themselves with the financial capital which is part of the A level course. Any teams not back in time were fined points and the last remaining team made it back with seconds to spare. It was a fast paced day which really enhanced the understanding of how important the City of London is to the UK Economy.
