#### War Child campaign secures £11m funding boost

Last week the War Child 'Learn to Live' campaign came to an end. The week saw Year 10 student Georgie Abbot help deliver a petition and letters to Downing Street calling on Theresa May to increase funding to support the mental health and emotional needs of children affected by conflict. The Government subsequently announced an £11 million boost for mental health support for children affected by war around the world. To celebrate the end of the campaign the four schools involved in the twinning projects were invited to the Evening Standard offices where they were hosted by the editor George Osbourne and owner Evgeny Lebedev (and his bodyguard). War Child celebrity ambassadors Vanessa Kirby, Carey Mulligan and Marcus Mumford also attended. All made the students feel incredibly welcome and praised their hard work and efforts during the course of the campaign. Students enjoyed a tour of the Evening Standard and Independent offices while there, getting the chance to produce their own front page. The event ended up making the real front page of the Evening Standard the next day.
