It has then taken at least that time again to go through the planning and consultation process. The crossing is much needed as many students cross the road at that point in order to use the 151 and 80 bus stop. This was despite the fact the road is very busy during rush hour times and despite the fact parked cars massively obscured visibility. There had been a number of close calls over the years where students narrowly avoided serious accidents. So while it may have taken time it is another example of our students bringing about positive change in the local community.






Harry Potter Accelerated Reader Trip
