

What should Year 12 be doing?

Developing well organised files with basic notes which should lead to evident transformation of learning.

Get the basics right

Access to the right online and hard copy resources

Planning and managing distractions

Sleep and healthy living habits



Sixth form students commit themselves to:

- Minimum **30 hours per week** commitment
- 100% attendance and punctuality
- All homework to be the quality of a student's target grade
- Independent work (Non contacts, Full working day)
- Being organised and prepared
- Balancing the freedom and responsibility of the 6th Form journey

Support available?

- Know targets & benchmark progress
- Encourage and monitor attendance
- Check and assist basic organisation
- Check and assist knowledge acquisition and transformation
- Help manage distractions, including part time jobs
- Understand the learning which should be underway & evident daily



Stages of learning

Distil down to key content (reading, notes, teaching)

'Chunk' or organise that content. Well organised folders support progress Testing, in class and at home. Individually and in groups.

Learning the right way

Transform information from one format into another Re-test on areas that he struggled with – not on areas he definitely knows

Exam style questions, exam papers, applying mark schemes, understanding examiner reports

Evaluation

Make and defend judgments based on internal evidence or external criteria.

Synthesis

Compile component ideas into a new whole or propose alternative solutions.

Analysis

Break down objects or ideas into simpler parts and find evidence to support generalizations.

Application

Apply knowledge to actual situations.
