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

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Reading at home this summer...



How to encourage reading at home

Reading for pleasure is not only a source of enjoyment but also a crucial factor in academic success and personal development. By fostering a love of reading at home, parents can significantly contribute to their child's educational journey and help reduce the inequality gap in education. This guide provides practical tips and strategies for parents to encourage their children to read for pleasure.





Academic Update

This half term students in year 12 have all made an excellent start on their year 13 courses after the intense AS exam series in May and June. Teachers have been setting out the key expectations for the next step up to full A level programs of study and getting a head start before the summer break teaching the year 13 curriculums. Many departments with coursework, controlled assessments and projects have also taken this time to make sure any outstanding work is up to date and ideas are being developed fully ready for the return to school in the autumn.

We know from experience that getting this head start before the holidays really puts our year 12 cohort at a significant advantage when they return as year 13 students. To make the most of this head start all students are advised to create a plan for study over the six week break to ensure they keep that momentum of learning going ready to hit the ground running in September.

This half term has also seen the launch of the Extended Project Qualification (EPQ) where students can undertake an independent research project on a topic they are interested in to add value to their Level 3 program of study. Mr Black has been meeting with the students each week to help them identify areas of interest and to understand what is involved in undertaking this additional qualification.

Trips & Events

This half term year 12 have continued to work on exploring next steps with many students attending a trip to the AMEX stadium to explore apprenticeships and university where many of our students made some valuable connections. We continue to sign off a lot of our students on open days this half term as universities open up their doors to give a taste of life at university and other courses. Students are allowed to attend up to three pre-approved open day visits during school time and many students have found it has helped them understand what they do and don't like about a campus or course.



The ASPIRE group of students have also been hard at work developing their future careers paths and took part in a drop down day including a workshop on liminal thinking – pushing themselves out of their comfort zone to expand their learning boundary. The day culminated in the group planning and organising their own picnic/team building event to build the connections with each other.

The whole year group also took part in the apprentice activity last week. This involved students in groups solving the "10 task challenge" – solving and finding 10 clues in different locations in London to earn points. Any late arrivals were fined or "fired". The pictures from the day show how hard some of the teams worked to move all over London to maximise their score with the winning team pictured above just edging it by 100 points!

During year 11 transition week our year 12 students were excellent ambassadors for what life in sixth form is like and many students volunteered to support the Stock Market Challenge event as traders – pictured below. It was a fast paced day and year 12 played an integral part in making our potential new students feel part of the community from the start.



It has been another busy year for all our university experiences with students from most year groups having an opportunity to visit universities and other widening participations experiences. During the year we have had visits to Sussex University, Kingston University, Oxford University, Reading University, St Mary's University, Roehampton University and Goldsmiths with over 300 students being involved in opportunities. In addition all students from year 8 upwards were involved in our Directions and Destinations in March.

University of Reading Scholars Project

Each student then completed a research project which was submitted to the university and marked by university undergraduates. The project is a fantastic experience for our students, developing their skills and giving them an insight to university life.


