My Child At School (MCAS)

MCAS is a system designed for parents to do the following

- Check your child's attendance
- Monitor their behaviour
- Look at homework (Work Outside the Classroom - WOTC)
- Order uniform, pay for trips and top up food accounts
- View data that the school holds for you/your child

Please ensure you have signed up to the App, to ensure you can support your child at home with their Work Outside The Classroom and their rewards & sanctions as appropriate

How to Sign Up

You can download the My Child At School app via the Apple App Store or Google Play Store.

Search for '**MyChildAtSchool**' (which will be listed by the publisher Bromcom Computers PLC).

If using a computer, please browse to <https://www.mychildatschool.com/>

1. If using the app you will be asked to allow it to send you notifications. Please choose "Allow/Yes"
2. Select "Self Sign Up" (app) or "Sign Up" website)
3. Enter the school postcode (SM5 IRW) and select "continue"
4. Enter your email address and select "Sign Up"

It is important that you enter the email address that you have registered with the school.

You will subsequently receive an email which will enable you to set a password to login to the system.

The first time you login you will be prompted to choose a 5 digit pin that will be used for subsequent logins (instead of your password). If you device supports it, you will also have the option to turn on biometric authentication.

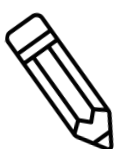
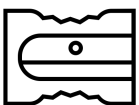

Black Skirt (*must be of an acceptable length to allow involvement in a wide range of activities during the school day, but maintain modesty. Hem must be on or close to the knee*)

CBSC School Jumper (*Optional*)

Note, the blazer must be worn at all times, unless students have permission to remove.

The data that is collected this week will be used for students to write up their Non Examined assessment part of the course. The Year 8 Science Fair recently wrapped up, showcasing the students' projects developed over the past few months. The event buzzed with excitement as the students presented their findings and creations.

The projects sparked lively discussions as the students shared their journey from planning to presentation. The boys' creativity, planning, and hands-on work shone through in their impressive projects.





Y10 Normandy Trip



The coach departed CBSC at 4.30am on Tuesday morning, carrying 35 very tired but excited Y10s! Our ferry crossing from Dover to Calais was smooth, and broken up by visits to the duty free shop – lots of new aftershave scents were purchased!

Once we made it to France, we made a couple of stops, firstly in the village of Amfreville, where from the high ground, Sword beach (one of the 5 D-Day Landing beaches) can be seen. We then visited Ranville, the first village liberated by the Allies at 2.30am on D Day, 6th June 1944. After a full day of travelling, students enjoyed a visit to the beach in the evening, before a relatively early bedtime!

Wednesday morning saw us up at 6.30am to ensure we made the most of our day. Our first visit of the day was to the Bayeux Tapestry, bringing to life what we have seen in our GCSE Anglo-Saxon and Norman England lessons. Staying in Bayeux, we then visited the Bayeux Cemetery, the largest British Second World War cemetery in France, and the Bayeux Memorial Museum, which tells the story of events between D-Day and August 1944. In the afternoon, we visited Pegasus Bridge, and the Pegasus Bridge museum. The bridge was a key strategic target of the Airborne divisions in the early hours of 6th June, to ensure the capture of Caen Canal, thereby enabling the British troops to be able to exit eastwards from their landing on Sword Beach.

Thursday morning saw another early start and a full day of historical visits. We visited two very different cemeteries – La Cambe (German) and Colleville (American), before then heading to Pointe Du Hoc, a key German defensive fortification that was captured by American Rangers as it was overlooking Omaha and Utah beaches. We finished Thursday's visits with a trip to the Musee Du Debarquement, which overlooks the remains of the Mulberry Harbour. These were two artificial harbours that were built specifically for the D-Day landings and were handling up to 18,000 tonnes of goods per day during the Allied liberation of occupied France. Students were then given some free time to explore Arromanches to spend the remainder of their spending money!

Friday was the final day of our trip, and once again saw us up nice and early! We began the day with our final historical visit to Caen museum, before then embarking upon our long journey home. Thankfully, there were no major hold ups at Calais, and we arrived back to school at approximately 10pm. Students (and staff!) were exhausted, but it was a truly excellent trip. The behaviour and conduct of all students was exemplary at all times on the trip, both when we were out and about and when in the accommodation. So much so that members of the public actually remarked to me how good they were, and the lady who ran the accommodation was in awe of how clean and tidy everything was left! I hope that all students who came enjoyed the trip, and have memories of it that they will treasure for years to come.

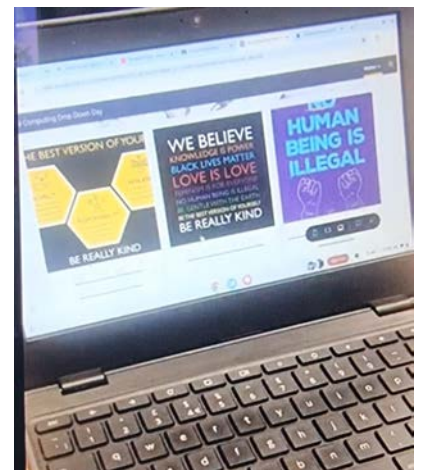


Computing

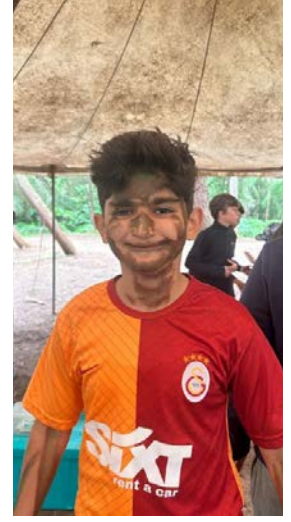

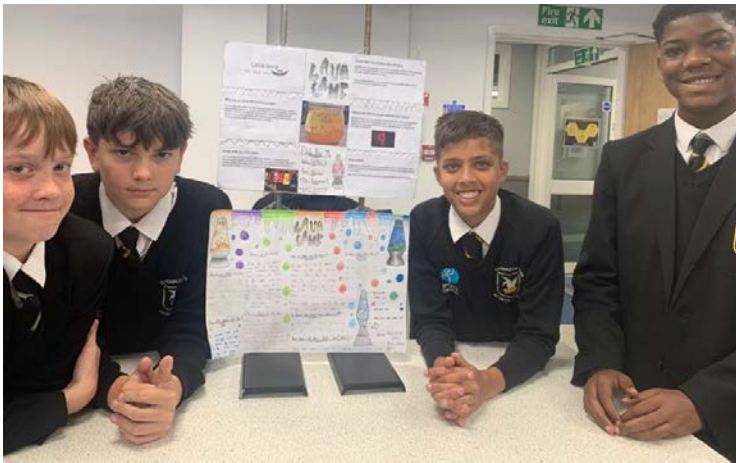

End of Year Exams Completion

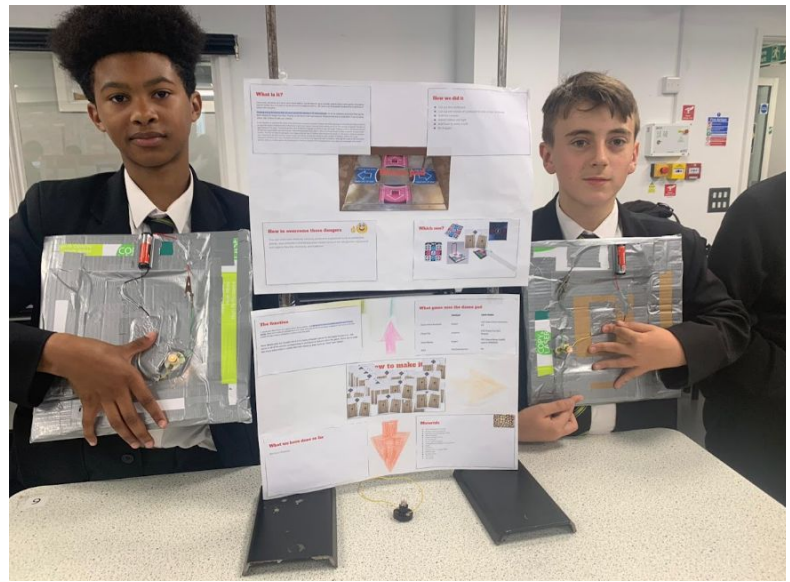

Sparx Reader

This year has seen an incredible boost to the reading culture at CBSC, with students completing over 28,000 hours of careful reading (via Sparx) since September 2023.

We are so proud of our KS3/KS4 students who have really embraced the power of Reading this year. A huge thank you to the parents and carers who are supporting their children with Reading at home.

According to a recent school survey, as many as **88%** of our KS3 pupils now recognise the importance of reading in their personal development, with **68%** admitting that their reading has improved this year. Almost half of our pupils reported an improvement in their concentration levels as a result of using Sparx, whilst **74%** recognised that they read more this year than last (with almost **40%** of pupils reading **7 or more books** since September).

With pupils reading, *enjoying* reading, and *talking about* reading more than ever before, the future looks very bright indeed!

Encourage reading at home this summer!

Reading for pleasure is not only a source of enjoyment but also a crucial factor in academic success and personal development.

By fostering a love of reading at home, you can significantly contribute to your child's educational journey and help bridge the inequality gap in education. This guide provides some practical tips and strategies for to encourage children to read for pleasure.

1. Set a Reading-Friendly Environment

Create a comfortable reading environment. Set up a cozy reading nook or designated space at home where your child can relax and focus on reading without distractions.

2. Lead by Example

Children often imitate their parents' behaviours, so let them see you engaging in reading regularly. Be a role model by reading books, magazines, or newspapers in their presence. Discuss what you've read and share interesting stories or facts, showing them how reading can be enjoyable and enriching.

3. Encourage Book Choices
